#### Constructivism Defined

- Primary focus on construction rather than composition
- Creation of art fostering an industrialized version, putting into mass production creations designed and produced as functional objects
- Art was based on materials used and was not for esthetics
- Art as a means of social purpose and not just as an object
- Embodied all forms of art, including photography
- Began in 1913 and ended in the mid 1920s in Russia; internationally, the movement survived in Germany until the 1950s

### Vladimir Tatlin (1885 - 1953)

- Vladimir Tatlin, Soviet painter, architect and sculptor, started the Russian Constructivism movement in 1919
- Important figure in the Soviet avantgarde art movement in the 1920's


# Monument to the Third International (1919 - 1920)



- Vladimir Tatlin's popular design and model, based on iron, steel and glass, was never produced
- Following the Bolshevik Revolution, structure was meant to be taller than the Eiffel Tower


# Aleksander Mikhailovich Rodchenko (1891 – 1956)

- Aleksander Rodchendo was a sculptor, photographer and graphic designer
- Most famous work in 1923 is the photomontage for Vladimir Mayakovsky's poem <u>About This</u>

- A single photograph was created of the final montage

### LEF's Influence on Photography



- LEF (Left Front of the Arts) established by the Russian Constructivists in the 1920's
- Responsible for a specific form of photography known for its jagged angles and abstract use of light

### Boris Ignatovich (1899 – 1976)

- Boris Ignatovich was a photographer, photo reporter and camera man
- Popular for his avant-garde photography in the 1920s and 1930s
